

TUTORING FOR TUITION

The Tutoring for Tuition Program gives high school students an opportunity to apply for positions as tutors for other students who need academic support.

DESCRIPTION

The program allows high school students entering into post-secondary institutions a chance to earn tuition vouchers by tutoring other students ranging in grades from primary to high school. It also ensures that students who require academic supports in order to maintain a satisfactory grade average are provided with such supports.

The Tutoring for Tuition Program is administered by the Career, Employment and Youth Services Division, Department of Human Resources, Labour and Employment in cooperation with school districts and schools and operates during the school year.

ELIGIBLE PARTICIPANTS (TUTORS)

Level I, II and III high school students with good academic standing and good interpersonal skills. Tutors will be selected by the school.

ELIGIBLE PARTICIPANTS (LEARNERS)

The learners will be identified by the school or school district and may range from primary to high school students.

OBJECTIVES

Learners: To ensure that “primary to high school” students who require academic supports in order to maintain a satisfactory grade average, are provided with such supports.

Tutors: To motivate and assist high school students with good academic standing, good interpersonal skills and financial need, to pursue post-secondary education.

To reduce the debt load accumulated by students pursuing post-secondary education.
